SESSION 1 – 1:15 PM – 2:30 PM

Title: Empowering Students of Color & Low-Income Students to Realize Selective College Admissions and Success

Members of ABAFAOILSS (Association of Black Admissions and Financial Aid Officers of the Ivy League and Sister Schools) will engage participants in discussion and reflection around selective college admissions. The session will be split into a panel and discussion roundtable for college access professionals. Panelists will discuss selective admissions and success for students of color and low-income students. The conversation will address holistic admissions and working with families and community-based organizations to find the right fit for students. The roundtable will open with a discussion on how to empower and prepare students for success, from application through enrollment stages. There will be an open question and response session following the discussion.

Title: Trends in Academic Advising: Access, Retention, Persistence
