

**Dr. Charles Price** is an Associate Professor in the Department of Policy, Organization, and Leadership Studies, in the College of Education of Temple University. His research, writing and activity focus on identity formation (racial identity; personal-individual identity; collective identity; Rastafari identity), life narrative genres, action research, community organizations and community organizing, social movements, and people-centered community development, with a geographic concentration on The United States and Jamaica. Charles authored the book *Becoming Rasta: The Origins of Rastafari Identity in Jamaica* (2009, New York University Press [NYU]), co-authored the monograph *Community Collaborations: Promoting Community Organizing* (2009, Ford Foundation), and many journal articles and book chapters. Charles and a colleague recently completed a NSF-Funded pilot study of Black men and resilience, in Greensboro, North Carolina, and Hartford, Connecticut. Charles is completing a book to be published with NYU Press, *Rasta: The Evolution of a People and Their Identity*.
